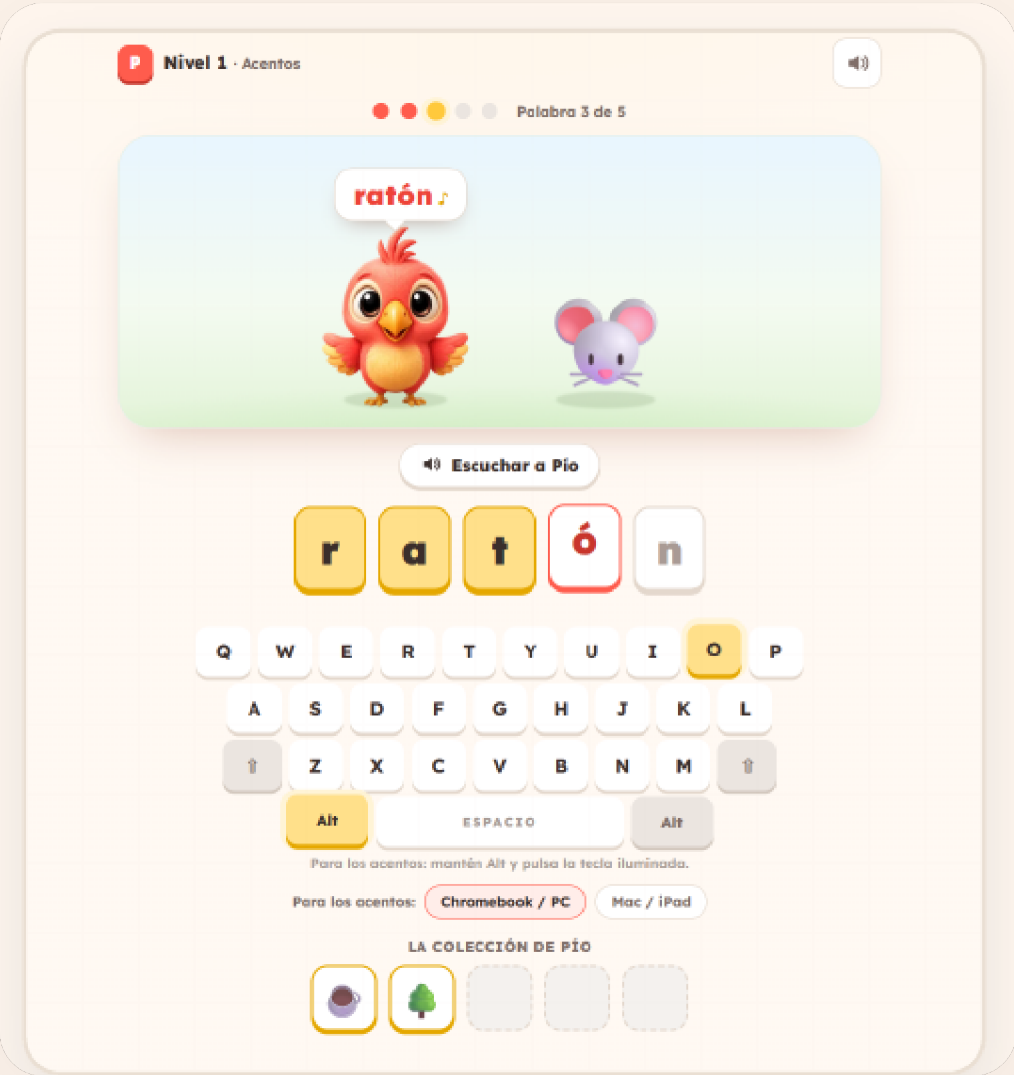
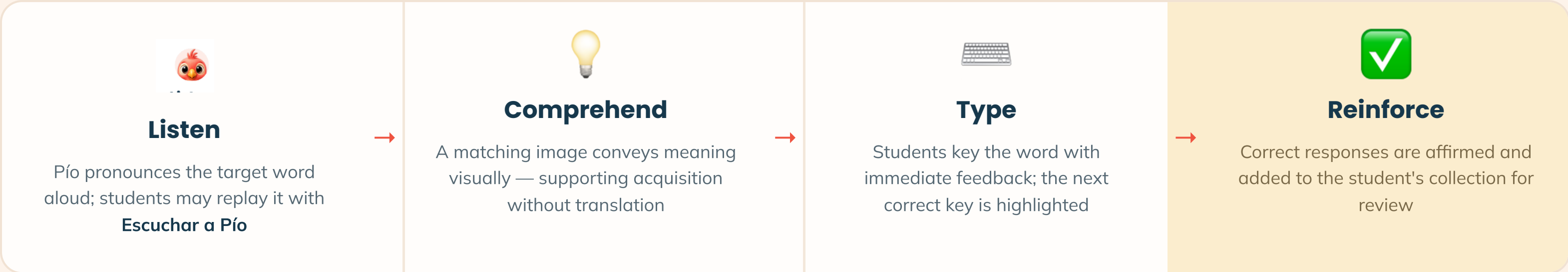




Spanish vocabulary and keyboarding — in one practice activity.

An introduction to Spanish for emerging readers. The practice activity mascot, Pío, pronounces each word aloud and a picture appears, so students associate sound with **meaning rather than an English translation**. Students then key the word letter by letter, guided by an on-screen highlight of the next correct key — building Spanish vocabulary and foundational keyboarding skills in a single, age-appropriate activity.



INSIDE A LESSON

Guided, accent-accurate practice

Pío says **ratón**, the picture appears, and the student types it. The screen guides every step — and teaches correct Spanish spelling along the way.

- Next key highlighted** — the exact key to press glows, so pre-readers always know where to go.
- Accents taught properly** — á é í ó ú ñ ü, with the modifier combo shown for Chromebook, PC, Mac & iPad.
- Progress in view** — word dots (*Palabra 3 de 5*) and a growing collection keep momentum visible.

Engaging, age-appropriate practice

Audio, animation, and positive reinforcement sustain attention and motivation for the youngest learners.

Built-in progress measures

Completed words are collected and a summary screen reports an accuracy score for each set — useful for informal assessment.

Designed for K–2 learners

Large letter tiles, single-word pacing, and clear progress indicators (**Palabra 3 de 5**) match early motor and attention skills.

Browser-based, no installation

Runs as a single web page across existing devices — no installs or extensions — with read-aloud audio and consistent **accessibility settings** district-wide.

Two skill areas, one practice activity.
